

Brief Interview with Dr. Felix-Martin Werner

1. How many years have you been practicing and/or performing research?

I practiced research about immunoscintigraphy in the years 1986 – 1993. I have been practising research about neural networks in collaboration with Prof. Covenas since 2001.

2. What is the research topic you are working on now?

I am working on elaborating neural networks in different brain regions and in different neurological and psychiatric diseases in order to improve a multimodal pharmacotherapy.

3. What makes an article top quality?

There different criteria which make an article quality. The quality of the methods, of the statistics, the discussion of the references and the quality of the presentation.

4. What are the qualities you look for in an article?

As far as the qualities are concerned, I look for the methods of investigation, the results that I can elaborate into my article, the references.

5. Do you have any research funding (NIH or other national funding) now?

No, I do not. I finance my scientific work by my main working place as a medical teacher at the Euro Academy in Pößneck. Partly, I obtain a support by the congresses or by the Institute of Neuroscience of Castilla and León in Salamanca in Spain.

6. When did you become an editor of OMICS Journal?

I become an editor of the journal Cytology & Histology at the beginning of the year 2014.

7. What is your greatest career accomplishment?

The greatest career accomplishment are the review about major depression published in 2010, because it was cited so many times, and the two congresses in Dubai, the 5.ICDDT and the 6.ICDDT.

8. How does the research published percolate through to practitioners?

I published an article about neural networks in Parkinson's disease. One practitioner administered L-dopa and an NMDA antagonist in an early stage of the disease and had a good result.

9. What is the purpose of serving as an editor?

The purpose of serving as an editor is to view the methods and the quality of papers of other institutions and to be helpful in publishing papers of a high quality.

10. Do you have any patents?

No, I do not have.

11. Have you contributed any editorials or papers (any types) to OMICS Journals in the past two years?

I submitted the article: Novel therapeutic approaches in major depression to the journal Cytology & Histology.

12. Do you plan to contribute any editorials or papers to OMICS Journals in the near future?

Yes, I plan to contribute other paper to OMICS Journals in the near future.

No, not at all.
